Pages 2, 4, 14, 21 & 27. The Florida 1911 pictures of Ella May show that she liked and enjoyed wearing hats. In January of 2019, we found the 3x5 card shown at the right in a drugstore ledger belonging to her husband Arthur. It announces the opening of Ella May's Three Fifty Hat Shoppe. The location at Sheridan and Kercheval in Detroit was just blocks from Arthur's drugstore and from their home. The hat price of \$3.50 equates to about fifty dollars today. The opening date, "October 6th Saturday" was likely in either 1923 or 1928.



Pages 3 & 5. Based on the assumption that this photo of Cam and Don is taken in the Cunningham front yard, and knowing where the packing plant in the background was located, South Florida historian Jeff Blakely said of A. R. Cunningham's home in Florida City: "My best guess for an address (today) would be somewhere close to 321 N.W. 1st St."

Pages 20, 21 & 25. Linda Cheek, great-granddaughter of Thomas and Clarissa Shields, has told us: "Eleanor (Shields Robinson) was the daughter of Thomas and Clarissa Shields, not Samuel and Dorcas Shields. Samuel and Dorcas had only the one son, Stuart Louis. Eleanor's name was actually Olive Eleanor, but I guess she didn't like Olive or Ollie."

Page 26. Claude Robinson was the son-in-law of Thomas and Clarissa Shields.
